Background – “Saving the Soul of America”

On April 4, 1967, Martin Luther King, Jr., speaking at Riverside Church in New York shared these words: For those who ask the question, "Aren't you a civil rights leader?" and thereby mean to exclude me from the movement for peace, I have this further answer. In 1957 when a group of us formed the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, we chose as our motto: "To save the soul of America." We were convinced that we could not limit our vision to certain rights for black people, but instead affirmed the conviction that America would never be free or saved from itself until the descendants of its slaves (*and all people*) were loosed completely from the shackles they still wear.

Mission Statement: To facilitate the process of national healing and reconciliation through collaboration with faith leaders, community leaders, elected and appointed officials.

Political Action: Here are some suggested actions local politicians/elected officials can do to advance healing and reconciliation locally and nationally.

Requested Actions

Politically Elected & Appointed Officials:

Which of these actions are you willing to advance?

1. **Sign on** to the online petition and share with your constituents.
2. **Draft and Formally adopt** a code of conduct/pledge to hold any person(s) and/or organization(s) perpetrating, violence accountable for their actions.
3. **Publicly agree** to deprioritize political party partisanship; act in a manner consistent with their responsibility for depolarizing our political process; more effectively uphold and defend the U.S. Constitution, thereby improving the quality of life within their authority.
4. **Propose and publicly advance** a Healing and Reconciliation Day/Week for your governing council and jurisdiction.
5. **Co-Host, with NFLC Faith Leaders,** a Joint Town Hall or Joint Public Hearing on Healing and Reconciliation with your constituents along with those of a different cultural or political demographic.

Mission Statement: Promote actions that help facilitate healing and reconciliation within and among congregations and communities throughout America.

Suggested Healing and Reconciliation Actions:
